

A LETTER FROM THE FOUNDER & EXECUTIVE PRODUCER

Dear Friends,

Inwood Art Works uses art as a platform to bring people together. Through our film, stage, and visual arts programs, we have used the Inwood neighborhood as a canvas to create and curate professional performing and visual arts in our community.

Our 2019 season began in January with out first-ever solo show, Bruce Katz's "Elevated Lines" photographs, which was also the final exhibition in our pop-up gallery on Broadway near Academy Street. The Gallery also played host to live music, entertainment, workshops, and community programs.

In early spring, we returned to Columbia University's Campbell Sports Center at the north end of the neighborhood at 218th Street and Broadway, where we presented the fourth annual Inwood Film Festival to sold-out houses for a fourth consecutive year.

Throughout the summer months, we planted ourselves (weekly) in the westernmost field of Inwood Hill Park to present the third annual season of New York City's only free outdoor English and Spanish cinema series, Film Works Alfresco.

The fall marked our season finale, where we presented our first, and very successful, standalone fundraiser at Republica Nightclub.

In a neighborhood without physical spaces for galleries, movie theaters, or playhouses, Inwood Art Works utilizes the neighborhood's existing resources – its gifted artists, compassionate audiences, and gorgeous geography – and organizes them through hyperlocal programming to create a cultural arts option in Northern Manhattan that would not otherwise exist.

With the continued growth and success of our programming, we continue to make a compelling case for our capacity to create and operate a dedicated venue for cultural arts in our community. Please join us in making it happen!



The Inwood Film Festival Filmmaker Fund was created to financially support and encourage the creation of cinema in the community by local Inwood filmmakers.

Applications are evaluated based on the following criteria:

- 1. The filmmaker must be a resident of the greater Inwood community.
- 2. Filmmakers must have at least one validated credit as a Producer, Director, or principal Director of Photography.
- 3. The participation of professional industry-proven personnel who are attached to the project.
- 4. It is not a student film.
- 5. While it is not required to be the focus of a project, locally-based stories with cultural relevance, historical associations, or geographical significance are given preference.

These filmmakers were awarded a grant up to \$5,000 to be used for film project expenses incurred between September 1, 2019 and August 31, 2020. Upon the completion of the project, the resulting film must be submitted to the selection committee for the Inwood Film Festival.

In a neighborhood bereft of a movie theater, Film Works Alfresco presented 15 movie screenings of diverse independent and popular films with cultural relevance to the Northern Manhattan community. This curated film series provided 11 free screenings, each opening with a live theatrical performance, at Gaelic Field in Inwood Hill Park every Monday evening at dusk from June 3 through August 26. Additionally, Film Works Alfresco presented a limited series of four screenings on the grounds of the historic Morris-Jumel Mansion from June through September.



Film Works Alfresco was the only free outdoor English and Spanish language cinema series to present bilingual programming in the five boroughs of New York City for the third straight year.





2,000 PEOPLE at

attended Film Works Alfresco

in 2019. This marks a 54% increase in audience attendance from 2018. Of those who attended, 20% were Lantinx, 14% were children, and 13% were seniors. These metrics verify that our programming was representational of our cultural community as well as expanding Northern Manhattan's public access to professional filmmaking.






TOTAL INCOME: \$143,179




Earned Income: \$19,616
